



Eleni Triantafyllidi has studied Archaeology in the department of History, Archaeology and Cultural Resources Management, in the University of the Peloponnese (BSc). She completed her BSc studies with a “practical training” in the Ephorate of Antiquities of Ancient Olympia. She also, participated in 2 field excavations (Asclepieion of Ancient Thouria and in ancient Elis). She completed her post -graduate studies with a MSc in Cultural Heritage Materials and Technologies (Cult-Tech) in the University of the Peloponnese. During her studies she received a State Scholarship Foundation (IKY).

Currently, is a PhD (2020) candidate focusing on the chemical analysis of Hellenistic- Roman pottery with the use of X-ray Fluorescence (XRF) and Scanning Electron Microscopy with Energy Dispersive Spectroscopy (SEM/EDS).
