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Kalamata, the second-largest city in the Peloponnese, is situated at the centre of the Messinian Bay and at the foot of the imposing Mount Taygetos. It is unique for its Mediterranean climate, beautiful landscape and close proximity to significant archaeological and tourist centres, such as Pylos. Kalamata is a remarkably cultural, vibrant and gastronomic city. About 10% of the city's population (90,000) are students. The city offers a vast variety of cultural and sport activities, as well as nightlife options.

International Dance Festival: The Kalamata International Dance Festival is the **key event** in the year of the city's International Dance Centre. The Centre was founded in the spring of 1995, charged with supporting and promoting the art of dance via research, education, and artistic activities and creativity. **Kalamata**, the city of dance, is set to host its 24th annual festival in July, 2018. Getting around: Kalamata enjoys great pedestrian and cyclist infrastructure, making walking and cycling the best ways of getting around. Local Buses run frequent services between the city centre and the sea front. The fare costs 1 euro. Tickets can be purchased at kiosks or inside the bus.

Lunches at the Campus: Coffee and Lunch will be provided within the campus for all students, free of charge, during all weekdays.

Accommodation: Economical accommodation is available in a number of hotels and apartments in Kalamata (30-40 euros per night, breakfast included). July is a high season period in Kalamata, so please make sure to book your accommodation in time!
